A State of Disaster has been declared with Stage 4 restrictions put in place for Metro Melbourne in response to the escalation in numbers in Victoria. It's not where we wanted to be, but is necessary to protect the vulnerable and safeguard our community and society from the Coronavirus.

For the Stage 4 lockdown there are new stay at home orders now in effect from 6pm Sunday 2nd August for the next six weeks. A **<u>curfew</u>** is now in operation **<u>from 8pm to 5am</u>** every evening with people only allowed to leave their house for work, and essential health, care or safety reasons.

LXR-Old Geelong Road

Earlier this year, designs for the level crossing removal were confirmed by the Level Crossing Removal Authority - a new road bridge will be built over the rail line east of the current crossing, directly connecting the Princes Highway to Old Geelong Road. A new pedestrian overpass will also be built at Hoppers Crossing Station.

Works commenced in April to set up site offices for the project along the Princes Highway. Underground services such as water and electricity will be relocated and once these works are completed, construction will begin on earthworks and piling for the bridge foundations.

Old Geelong Road Level Crossing is expected to be finished by 2022. You can find out more about the project <u>here</u>.



Tarneit Train Station

Works are set to commence soon on the upgrade to Tarneit Station's car park, as part of the Victorian Government's Carparks for Commuters Fund, which aims to build 11,000 extra parking spaces at train stations across Victoria. As part of this fund, Tarneit station will receive 500 extra parking spaces.



The Department of Transport, as part of early development works, is evaluating all available options, geotechnical/ ground conditions, construction and environmental considerations.

At the end of last month, geotechnical evaluations were conducted at Tarneit Station to determine appropriate design choices. These evaluations include land surveys, locating underground utilities and services and ground and soil evaluations.

Supporting Community Sports

I want to thank and congratulate all sporting clubs who applied for the Victorian Government's Community Sports Sector COVID-19 Survival Package.

This fund is designed to assist local community sporting clubs, big and small, as they recover from the Coronavirus pandemic. Up to \$40 million has been made available to help clubs across Victoria, including small grants of \$1,000 for individual sports clubs, which is aimed to help local clubs with basic running costs and supporting a return to play when it is safe to do so.

Dohertys Creek P-9 College Stage Two Funding \$11.2M

Earlier this year, Truganina residents received welcome news that Doherty's Creek P-9 College, which opened last year, had received \$11.3 million from the Victorian Government's \$2.7 billion Building Works Fund. This funding will go towards commencing Stage 2 works, expanding the school's learning facilities. I want to thank members of the school community, including Principal Ian Wren, for their advocacy in securing this funding.

Once these works are complete, Doherty's Creek will truly be a P-9 school, with enrolments for years 7-9 to commence in 2022.



Truganina South East Primary School (Opens 2021)

The Department of Education has recently appointed Natalie Nelson to be the first Principal of our newest school, Truganina South East Primary School.

'Natalie Nelson has a passion for creating vibrant communities where students excel, and parents feel connected to the school. Prior to commencing at Truganina South East Primary School (interim name), she was the principal at Ashburton and Altona Primary School.'

Part of the Andrews Government's commitment to build 100 new schools by 2026, the school will include: two learning neighbourhoods, an administration building, outdoor play courts, performing arts and physical education building, and a sports field.

Supporting Student Mental Health

Rental Relief - Residential & Commercial

We have introduced a fair system to support tenants and landlords during the pandemic.

This includes a \$80 million fund whereby tenants can receive financial assistance in paying their rent after they go through a mediation process with their landlord.

There are several more programs funded under the Rental Relief Package.

Business Support

To support businesses impacted by Stage 4 restrictions, one-off grants will be made available to eligible businesses under the Business Support Fund – Expansion program:

- \$10,000 for employing businesses in metropolitan Melbourne and Mitchell Shire in recognition of spending longer under restrictions
- \$5,000 for employing businesses in regional local government areas (except Mitchell Shire)

Businesses which have already received a Business Support Fund - Expansion grant, or have applied for one, will not need to re-apply. Successful applicants will automatically receive this additional allocation.

Applications for the program will be extended until 14 September 2020
